Dear parents, carers, and friends of GRC,

Whilst we had plans in place to respond to the predicted increase of infections the reality was very different. As more and more students were diagnosed, and staff became unwell too we did find our resources incredibly stretched. We did, however, maintain a certain "business as usual approach" with student wellbeing remaining our primary focus. Sincere thanks to the parents that quickly responded to our calls to collect their children. However, at times the number of students isolating did take its toll on resourcing and infection control. I take this opportunity to remind ALL parents that we provide a service for students to attend their chosen school, when they are diagnosed with an infectious disease or a long-term illness, or suspension, parents are required to collect their children or make local arrangements for their care.

We enjoyed many activities with surf runs a hot favourite as always, and Lego building a great activity for isolating students. Next term we are commencing fortnightly Art Classes with many of the girls signed up and very excited.

In week 8 of the Term, I had the great privilege of attending the National Indigenous Education Boarding Symposium in NSW. The experience was truly humbling, and it created the space for me to reflect on what we have achieved in our cultural awareness and responsive practice journey. Education underpins every part of life and it only strengthen my resolve to provide a caring and culturally safe boarding environment for our Indigenous students. We have many projects planned for the remainder of the year, with our Indigenous Artwork on our front wall a key initiative. Both Indigenous and non-Indigenous students will be engaged throughout the project with completion culminating in August when we celebrate NAIDOC 2022.

Anne-Marie has been appointed to the role of College Manager at Moora following her long service leave in Weeks 1-2 of Term 3. 
