Djeran: A new season.

As we are approaching the end of term please note it's the start of a new season in Noongar culture.

Djeran (April – May) is also known as the **season of Adulthood** which sees a break in hot weather. The cooler nights and discovering dew in the early mornings are key indicators of the change in season. This is also the fire season - time to burn for several reasons including fuel reduction, increasing the grazing pastures for animals and to support seed germination for some plants. The winds have also changed to light breezes and generally from the southerly directions. Banksias start to flower ensuring the many small mammals and birds that rely on nectar, are fed. Other plants that contribute to this seasons beauty are the formation of cones from the Sheoaks/Allocasuarina fraseriana (Kwerl) and the buds of Eucalyptus pleurocarpa (Tjaltjraak). You will also start to see the flower stalks of the Grass Trees (Balga/Balak). Flying ants can be seen cruising in the light southerly winds and historical accounts suggest that Noongar people employed the services of dolphins to help catch the increasing supply of sea food. Other food sources that traditionally form part of Noongar people's diet are seeds and bulbs.

Djeran is represented by the colour green.

Bus trips - Just a quick reminder that the bus trips are a courtesy service and as such, students need to remember that with so many people wanting to be somewhere or picked up at the same time to allow 15 minutes in getting to and from your destination.
