
REACH Program



As you may be aware, we are in the process of implementing a new Boarding programme called Reach. This is a student management software designed for the residential college, which automates control and monitoring procedures for the college. It will allow us to establish and control procedures with complete tracking and reporting capability for a wide range of core activities. It will also have the ability to provide all data for integration with our existing management systems.

It will simplify our operations and save us time with efficient, fully traceable and reportable transactions that will help us to reduce risk and improve student care.

We will be asking both parents and students to download apps onto their phones (We will send you the relevant links shortly and will also be asking you to complete a form with requests for usernames and passwords that you would like to use to log ono the app. We will also need your email addresses, as well as mobile numbers.



We have already installed most of the hardware, (you might have noticed a few TV's and a giant IPad that have been installed in various places around the college). So hopefully we will be up and running in the first few weeks of the term.

FEES

The Parent shall pay to the Residential College the Annual Boarding and Amenities Fee.

- 1.1 A non-refundable deposit of \$300 is to be paid within four weeks of receiving an offer of accommodation, except for students whose fees are fully covered by government allowances.
- 1.2 For students who are not eligible for a boarding allowance, the Boarding and Amenities Fee is payable in advance in three instalments on the first day of Terms 1, 2 and 3.
- 1.3 For students in receipt of AIC and BAHA allowances it is a condition of placement that these allowances are paid direct to the Residential College. The balance is payable by parents in one instalment on or be fore the first day of Term 1.
