## GIFTED AND TALENTED MUSIC THEATRE PROGRAM Information for Applicants for Entry in 2024

It is important that you read the information below to assist your child in preparation for their Music Theatre workshop.

Your child's workshop will include Dance choreography, song and performance. There is no preparation required for this component of the workshop.

Your child will also need to prepare and memorise a monologue that you will receive in your call back information pack.

If your child has a diagnosed condition, learning difference, illness or injury that may affect their performance in the workshop or their ability to recite their monologue, please contact the Gifted and Talented Selection Unit prior to their session and request to speak to the lead supervisor at sign in. Appropriate documentation to support their condition must be provided, if not already supplied in their workshop.

The session is held in an encouraging environment and all of the activities should be an enjoyable experience.

## What to wear

Your child is to wear comfortable, form-fitting clothing that is suitable for free movement, such as tracksuit pants or shorts with a form-fitting shirt, or Dance clothing. Applicants must not wear jeans, skirts or dresses. Hair is to be tied back and no jewellery or make-up is to be worn. The workshop will be conducted in bare feet.

## Essential items to bring to the workshop

- A photocopy of your child's most recent school report (if not already provided).
- A bottle of water.

On arrival at the venue, any forms that were not provided in the first workshop should be handed to the administration staff at the workshop registration table. Any serious health conditions should be brought to the attention of the administration staff at the time of registration.

The exact finishing time of the workshop will be confirmed when you arrive at the venue, however it is expected to run for 1.5 hours. All students must be collected promptly and will not be allowed to leave without the escort of a parent/guardian unless prior permission has been obtained. If you or another parent/guardian are unable to collect your child from their workshop, please contact the Gifted and Talented Unit prior to their session to inform us of who will be collecting them.

To allow for effective planning of groups, please provide a minimum of three days' notice if you wish to withdraw your child from their session.

You will be contacted directly by staff at John Curtin College of the Arts for an interview if your child is successful following their call back
