All applicants must provide four (4) items of identification, as per:

- One (1) from Commencement of identity documents
- One (1) from Primary use in the community documents
- Two (2) from Secondary use in the community documents
- At least one (1) of your four documents must include a recent photograph of you
- All identification must be current (expired documents cannot be accepted)

Photograph and identity verification:

- An Authorised person listed in <u>Schedule 2</u> of the <u>Statutory Declarations Regulations 2018 (Cth)</u> (see Appendix A) must verify your identity by comparing your photographic identity documents with a face-to-face comparison of you, in-person.
- The verifier must include their full contact details and sign the **Photograph and Identity Verification** section of your Summary Sheet.
- Alternatively, the photograph verification may be conducted via remote sighting (e.g. webcam, skype, video conference) ensuring both parties and all ID documents are clearly visible.
- If you provide identity documents in a former name, e.g. Maiden name, you must provide evidence of the name change, **in addition** to your four identity documents.

Submitting your application:

- In person Applicants delivering their application in-person to the Screening Unit can request that a Screening Officer verify their identity. You must bring **original** documents for face-to-face comparison.
- **By post or email** applicants can post or email their application to the Screening Unit, but must have the Photograph and Identity Verification section correctly completed and signed prior to sending.
