Introduction

This report summarises the 2023 National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) results for Western Australian (WA) public school students.

Introduced in 2008, NAPLAN is conducted annually across Australia in all schools.

From 2023 changes to NAPLAN were introduced. NAPLAN moved to Term 1 (previously Term 2), with testing conducted in March; student achievement is reported against 4 levels of proficiency (Exceeding, Strong, Developing and Needs Additional Support), replacing the previous NAPLAN bands and national minimum standards; and the NAPLAN measurement scales and time series have been reset.

Around 93,100 WA public school students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 sat the national literacy and numeracy tests in 2023. Almost all students sat the assessments online, excluding the Year 3 writing assessment which remains a paper-based test.

Trends and comparisons

With the introduction of new NAPLAN scales in 2023 a new time series has commenced. NAPLAN results from 2023 should not be compared to previous years.

Any given score on an assessment represents the same level of achievement over time. For example, a score of 500 in Reading is equivalent to the same score in future testing years.

Notes and definitions

The number of students (Students) includes all students who sat the test, as well as those who were exempt, absent or formally withdrawn from the test(s). Assessments for the same year level may show different numbers of students as a result of students moving interstate, overseas or transferring out of public schooling during the NAPLAN testing period.

Participation rates (Participation) comprise students who either sat the tests or were exempt, as a proportion of all students including absent and withdrawn students.

Exempt students are those who were granted formal exemptions because they had a significant intellectual or functional disability; or were from a non-English speaking background and had been in Australia for less than one year.

Mean is the average score for the students. The means include imputed scores for students who were absent or withdrawn from the test(s) but not exempt students.

Standard Deviation (SD) is a measure of the spread in the scores across students.

Proficiency levels are used to report student achievement. There are 4 proficiency levels:

- Exceeding: the student's result exceeds expectations at the time of testing.
- Strong: the student's result meets challenging but reasonable expectations at the time of testing.
- **Developing:** the student's result indicates that they are working towards expectations at the time of testing.
- **Needs additional support (NAS):** the student's result indicates that they are not achieving the learning outcomes that are expected at the time of testing. They are likely to need additional support to progress satisfactorily.

Gender is as reported by students and/or parents in their school enrolment records.

Aboriginal students are those who identify as being of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander origin, as indicated on school enrolment records.




Percentage of Year 3 public school students in each proficiency level, 2023


Percentage of Year 5 public school students in each proficiency level, 2023


Percentage of Year 7 public school students in each proficiency level, 2023

Percentage of Year 9 public school students in each proficiency level, 2023



Percentage of Year 3 students in each proficiency level by gender, 2023



Percentage of Year 5 students in each proficiency level by gender, 2023



Percentage of Year 7 students in each proficiency level by gender, 2023



Percentage of Year 9 students in each proficiency level by gender, 2023




Percentage of Aboriginal Year 3 public school students in each proficiency level, 2023


Percentage of Aboriginal Year 5 public school students in each proficiency level, 2023
