



RESIDENTIAL COLLEGE COSTS – 2019

There is a standard accommodation fee of **\$14,143** at all residential colleges. It covers the bed, meals, facilities and pastoral care of each student. It is payable by the student's parent/s.

Private school students may pay an additional boarding fee to their school. Parents should contact their school to find out the amount of any additional fee.

The full cost of boarding to the Department of Education is **\$22 835**.

The standard fee does not apply to international students. See the table below for their fee amount.

If students are eligible for further allowances/subsidies, the accommodation fee could be reduced.

**ABSTUDY and Youth Allowance are subject to an income test. Where a student is eligible for the full allowance there may be little or no cost.*

To allow the residential college to invoice parents the reduced amounts, parents need to ensure any financial assistance is paid directly to the residential college. If this is not done, the full accommodation fee will be required to be paid by the parent/s.

In addition to the accommodation fee, amounts are charged to cover individual services which may be provided for students. Individual services may include, but are not limited to, services such as transport uniforms, tutoring, counselling, medical services, medical supplies, camps and outings.

Assistance for Isolated Children Scheme (AIC)

A basic boarding allowance, **\$8,422** in 2019 and indexed annually, is provided by the Australian Government to children who:

- live at least 56 kilometres from the nearest appropriate government school via any school bus or public transport service route;
- live at least 16 kilometres from the nearest appropriate government school via school bus or public transport and at least 4.5 kilometres from the transport pick-up point;
- have to travel more than 3 hours daily to and from school via any school bus route; or
- meet one of the Scheme's other isolation or special needs criteria.

Subject to an income test an additional boarding allowance, indexed annually, may be payable (up to **\$2,416** from 1 January 2019) for primary and secondary school students.

Boarding Away from Home Allowance (BAHA)

All recipients of the basic AIC Boarding Allowance are eligible for the State Government *Boarding Away from Home Allowance (BAHA)* amounting to **\$1,791** in 2019. This allowance is administered by the Department of Education.

Youth Allowance

Depending on parental income, family assets, and, in some cases family actual means, a student may receive a higher level of Australian Government assistance if he or she is eligible for Youth Allowance.

In general, students 16 years and over should apply for Youth Allowance if they would receive more than \$11,590.80 (i.e. AIC Basic and Additional Boarding allowances plus BAHA) and any Family Tax Benefit for the student. Note that while AIC and BAHA eligibility does not affect your Family Tax Benefit, the Family Tax Benefit is not available to Youth Allowance recipients. Note too, that eligibility for the Away-from-Home rate for Youth Allowance for isolated secondary students is different in some respects from the AIC and BAHA allowance eligibility criteria.

ABSTUDY

ABSTUDY assists eligible Indigenous students with boarding, travel and tuition costs. Note that the Family Tax Benefit is not available for *ABSTUDY* Living Allowance students aged 16 or over.

Gifted and Talented Education (GATE) Boarding Allowance

Country students who are offered a place at one of the metropolitan gifted and talented education programs and who are not eligible for any of the abovementioned allowances may be eligible for this allowance which amounts to **\$1,791** in 2019. This allowance is administered by the Department of Education.

Student Subsidised Travel Scheme and Road Travel Subsidy

Students living in the "defined remote area" of the State may be eligible for subsidised travel (air, bus or rail) between home and school at the beginning and end of each school term. The Department of Transport administers the subsidies available for student transport.
