Consent₂Go

We are excited to announce we are officially using Consent2Go, a digital solution which easily enables you to keep your child's health records accurate and provide consent for school events, excursions and camps in a secure and timely manner.

We are always looking for ways to enhance our student care and after careful evaluation of our requirements, and of providers in the market, we have made the decision to use Consent2Go. <u>Consent2Go is a direct provider of services to the school and as such is required to comply with our Privacy Policy.</u>

Consent2Go is used in many other schools across Australia and New Zealand and is proven to be highly effective.

With this system you are able to view and update your child's information and health records from the comfort of your own home, either via your computer or your phone/device. You will also be able to be informed of and give consent for activities organised by the College and hopefully the school notes that they send here with the students.

It is being rolled out across all of the Colleges in the state and we are the first one to have it formally up and running.

As with all systems, it will take a while to get used to it, but hopefully this will do away with a lot of our paper notes and permission forms and streamline our administrative side of record keeping.

Please keep an eye on your emails as we will be sending out the welcome email which will prompt you to review and accept the information we already have on record, or change what needs to be changed and then update the record to keep us up to date with everything relevant to your child's wellbeing.


