- Applications, testing and selection managed by schools
- Funded by the school
- For existing or inbound students enrolled at the school
- Information on individual school websites

#### 2. Approved Specialist programs

- Approved by the Department of Education currently approx. 100
- Applications, testing and selection managed by schools
- Funded by the school
- Local catchment and potential for outside intake

- Applications, testing and selection all managed by the Department of Education
- No advantage for local catchment students
- Students can apply for later years (9, 10 and 11) if they are unsuccessful
- Over 7000 applicants from WA, interstate and overseas in 2025
- online program for regional students
- 24 face-to-face across Perth Metro, Bunbury and Albany
- Full time placement at the school from Year 7-12





Is a home away from home allowing WA regional students the ability to live/board in Perth and attend Gifted and Talented programs in public schools in the Perth metro area.



## What's in the ASET?

The ASET has four <u>equally weighted</u> components that are completed in the following order:

- Reading Comprehension
- Communicating Ideas in Writing

10-minute break

- Quantitative Reasoning
- Abstract Reasoning

- Assesses students' ability to understand and interpret different text types
- May include fiction, non-fiction, poetry and plays, together with diagrams, tables, charts and maps.
- No special knowledge in the subject area is required.
- All the information you need to answer the questions is printed on the test paper.
- No reference books or assistive tech

#### **FORMAT**

- 35 minutes
- 35 multiple choice questions



# Multiple choice marking

- Machine-scored with manual oversight
- Only read pencil marks
- Students must mark their answers in their answer book as they go
- Question books and rough working not marked
- One point for each correct answer
- No penalty for guessing

# Communicating Ideas in Writing (CIIW)

Your writing must be based on the below prompt. You can write in any style.

- Not a test of functional literacy such as NAPLAN, etc
- On-the-spot ideas generation and thinking in writing
- Emphasis on interesting and original content meaningfully connected to the prompt
- How well the student's writing choices showcase their ideas
- Students need to produce an impromptu piece of writing based on the prompt they are given on the day
- Prompt might be an image, piece of text or a combination of both
- Might focus on setting or character, a relevant concept or concepts, or a particular viewpoint.
- Can write in any style that best delivers ideas in a vivid and interesting way
- Can use pencil or pen
- 25 minutes
- Time starts when they see the prompt
- Examples:

Some rules are good. Some aren't.

Your writing must be based on the below prompt. You can write in any style.



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# Writing marking

- Planning is optional it won't be marked
- Minimum of two independent markers for each piece
- Connection to prompt must be a clear and crucial aspect not dropped in to 'meet the brief'
- Adjudication process if connection is lacking
- Tenuous, out-of-context and forced connections will receive very low scores
- No connection = off task = zero score



# **Quantitative Reasoning**

- Assesses mathematical and scientific reasoning ability (not based on school curriculum)
- Candidates will be required to:
  - extract and interpret information
  - identify relationships, connections, similarities and differences
  - solve problems
- No calculators, rulers or assistive tech

#### **FORMAT**

- 35 minutes
- 35 multiple choice questions






In this example the rule is that one dot is added to each box going from left to right, so the answer is A.






In this example the shape in the box at the right of each row is made by combining the shapes in the first two boxes of the row, so the answer is **B**.

# Illness, incident or misadventure review requests

You can request a review within seven days of your child's testing if something unexpected occurred which may have had a negative impact

Forms available on the website once testing has commenced

#### Reviews can be conducted based on:

- Suspected misalignment of multiple-choice answers
- Test centre problems or disruptions
- Unforeseen illness or injury during or between tests

#### Reviews will **not** be conducted based on:

- Known conditions
- Voluntary and avoidable activities before the test
- Lack of familiarity or finding the test difficult or stressful
- Not following the test rules or instructions

# Changing your preferences

You can change child's preferences after you receive their performance report except for:

- New arts preferences all arts testing will have concluded by this time.
- New languages preferences must be added by 22 May 2026 to be included in the first round of interviews. Additions after this date will be for a potential second round of interviews

Changes must be requested by phone or email by a parent/carer listed on the child's application.

Preference change requests must be received by GTSU by the deadline on the Performance Report email (usually 7 days) for Round 1 consideration.

Changes requested after 7 days will be for Round 2 and beyond.

## Results checks

#### A Results Check is a process of verification to ensure

- Data was matched correctly
- No scanning errors in the multiple-choice tests
- Writing task appropriately scored


No checks for illness, incident or misadventure (includes misalignment)

Outcomes will be known after Round 1 but before Round 2




# Minimum 210 TSS for academic programs



# Responding to a Round 1 offer

You will have up to <u>four</u> choices, depending on the offer you receive:

### **1. Accept** your offer

You will need to commence enrolment at the school.

You will not receive any other offers of placement.

#### **2. Decline** your offer

This offer will be reallocated to another child.

You will be automatically considered for higher preference offers in the Round 2.

### 3. **Hold** your offer (for second and third preference offers only)

This place will be offered to you again if you do **not** qualify for a higher preference offer in Round 2.

If you **do** get a higher preference offer, this offer will automatically be reallocated to another student.

#### 4. Withdraw

This offer will be reallocated to another child in the Round 2.



# Responding to a Round 2 offer

You will have up to <u>four</u> choices, depending on the offer you receive:

#### **1.** Accept your offer **NO** other preferences

You will need to commence enrolment at the school.

You will not receive any other offers of placement.

#### **2. Accept** your offer **YES** other preferences

You will need to commence enrolment at the school.

You may be placed on the reserve list to be considered for any higher preference places if they become available.

If you receive a higher preference offer, you will have 48 hours to decide.

#### **3. Decline** your offer

This offer will be reallocated to the next eligible student.

You may be placed on the reserve list to be considered for any higher preference places, if they become available.

#### 4. Withdraw

This offer will be reallocated to the next eligible student on the reserve list.

You will not be considered for any further offers of placement.

# **Enrolling at the school**

- If you ACCEPT an offer of placement you will be required to enrol at the school
- If you do not enrol or cannot meet enrolment criteria by the stated deadline, the offer will be withdrawn
- This also applies for families who ACCEPT YES other preferences

## **Reserve lists and Reserve Round offers**

- All children who did not receive an offer of placement in Round 1 or 2 will receive an unsuccessful notification early August
- Children who receive an unsuccessful notice will be automatically placed on Reserve Lists for their preferences if they meet the eligibility requirements
- Academic program reserve list eligibility will vary
- Arts and Languages eligibility requires the child having progressed to the interview stage
- All Reserve List offers will be made by email. You will have two working days to respond
- Only families who receive an offer of placement will be contacted
- Reserve Lists will close on 1 December 2026 no more offers for 2027. Vacancies becoming available after this time will go into the Year 9 intake pool for 2029
