



Inglewood Primary School New classroom building

As you may be aware, a new classroom building is being built at Inglewood Primary School. This factsheet has been developed to answer questions for the local community.

Why is a new classroom building needed?

Student enrolments at this well regarded school are increasing. To meet the growing needs of the school, a new \$3.5 million double storey classroom building will be constructed. The new building will provide permanent classrooms for an additional 192 students who would otherwise be housed in transportable classrooms on the school oval.

What will be included in the new classroom building?

The new classroom building will include six classrooms, internal activity areas, student toilets, staff collegiate room, storerooms and an outdoor parent seating area.

Where will the new building be located?

It will be located on the corner of Normanby Road and Robinson Street.



Were alternative sites for the teaching building investigated?

Yes, alternative locations including along Robinson Street and Crawford Road were considered however, the preferred location has the smallest impact on available play space.

What impact does the increased student enrolments have on local traffic?

To lessen the impact of traffic, school staff and P&C will monitor the kiss and drive area to move on vehicles and prevent queuing. Additionally, parents will be encouraged to walk to school and car pool where possible. The only additional land for onsite parking is the school oval.

How will the new building be designed to address local heritage guidelines?

The Department is working with the City of Stirling to respect the traditional character of the Inglewood area. The new building incorporates colour schemes, façade treatments and brick work sympathetic to the existing school buildings. For example, the new double storey building will be only 1.9 metres higher than the adjoining single storey classroom building. The new building's identity is defined by the school's history of additions and alterations to meet contemporary needs.



Was the school community informed of the new classroom building?

Information was provided to the School Council and the Parents and Citizens' Association. Information to parents was also provided in school newsletters and through information sessions. Plans are also available for viewing at the school.

How was the local community informed of the new classroom building?

Consultants for the Department of Finance, Building Management and Works recently contacted residents who are directly facing the proposed development. Additionally, this information sheet has been provided to the local Inglewood community.
