New classroom building

This factsheet provides further information about the design and location for a new teaching block for Inglewood Primary School.

Following consultation and listening to local concerns and opinions the new building has been redesigned and the location has been changed.

Where is the new location for the classroom building?

The new teaching block will be positioned adjacent to the school's existing music and toilet block, and will face the school oval. This improved location has been made possible because the Department of Education purchased a portion of a 'right of way', similar to those that run behind many Inglewood properties.

How will the new location impact local residents?

The new building runs north-south on the school site. There will be a street presence on Crawford Road – the narrow side of the new building. New trees will be planted to soften the look and will blend with existing trees. The transportable classroom currently in this location will be permanently removed. The view from Robinson Street towards the new building is screened by existing trees and the school oval is between that road and the school. There will be minimal impact for Normanby Road residents.

What impact does the new location have on play space?

The school oval is currently 3,990 square metres. The new location will reduce that by 554 square metres. However the original proposed location reduced play space by 780 square metres so the new design reduces the space lost.

Will the new design address heritage guidelines?

The new design reflects community feedback, has been approved by the City of Stirling and meets all heritage guidelines. The design is sympathetic to the Inglewood heritage aesthetic and features a traditional hipped roof, a red brick building, an extension of the masonry fence to Crawford Road, heritage-style window frames that match existing buildings, and traditional railing balustrades to the upper level.

What are the advantages of the new location and design?

The new plan means: less play space will be lost; there will be no impact on any school buildings during construction; the school will retain its access ways to the oval; and street presence will be minimised.

Will any trees be removed?

Two trees will be removed – one along Crawford Road and one near the covered assembly area. This is the same number as per the previous proposal. Four trees will be planted as replacements.
